Build an Abaco Parrot Nest

Materials:

- 1. empty oatmeal container or similar cylindrical container, cut in half longitudinally
- 2. adult parrot, chick and egg cut outs (from Bahama Parrot colouring book)
- 3. paint, crayons, markers
- 4. glue
- 5. real leaves or leaves cut out of paper or magazines

How to:

- 1. Have an adult use a serrated knife or scissors to cut the container. Poster board can also be used for a 2D nest.
- 2. Paint/colour the "nest" to resemble limestone.
- 3. Cut out and colour parrots, chicks and eggs.
- 4. Attach chicks and eggs at the bottom of the nest (nest floor).
- 5. One parent could be attached inside the nest and another at the entrance.
- 6. Decorate the nest entrance with plants. In nature this camouflage helps protect the parrots.
- 7. Display your project!

Discussion:

As you cut out the parrots and colour them you can talk about characteristics: colour, size, etc. Talk about the habitat that the parrots live in. Gradually build and decorate the nest. Discuss why the parrots nest in the ground: why is it a benefit? Why not nest in trees? Can it be a bad thing - why? What are the threats faced by Bahama Parrots? Can any of these be avoided? Talk about forest fires and hurricanes and their potential effects.

Alternatives:

1. Create cut outs of some common parrot predators: snakes, cats, raccoons, etc. Introduce them to the nest and discuss what the result might be.
